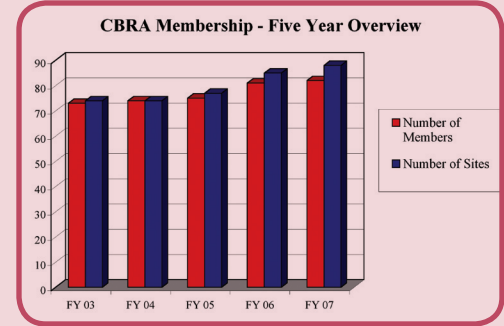

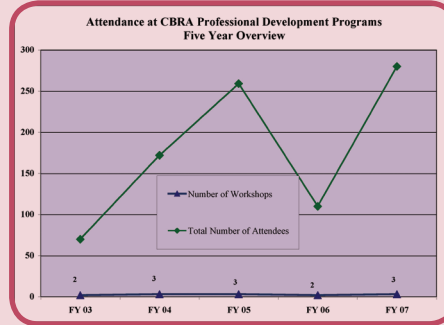

CBRA Annual Governing Board Meeting

The Annual Meeting of the CBRA Governing Board took place on May 10th at the Stanford Court Hotel in San Francisco. CBRA hosted a luncheon for all CBRA Governing Board representatives, invited guests, and Board members, followed by the Business Meeting.

CBRA Governing Board members expressed a commitment to remain actively engaged and ever vigilant regarding legislative issues that impact biomedical research at the local, state, and federal levels, and asked that staff continue to increase member services, expand professional development workshops and initiatives regarding compliance, and continue with CBRA training programs regarding site security, employee education, and public outreach.

Following the Business Meeting, at the educational session CBRA's members and representatives heard from Officer Scott Savage from the City of Palo Alto Police Department regarding “New Tactics and Strategies of Animal and Eco Terrorist Groups: An Update and Overview of Criminal Investigations”, and from Peggy G. Lemaux, Ph.D., Department of Plant and Microbial Biology at the University of California, Berkeley on “Food Fights in the Marketplace: GE Foods and the Consumer”.

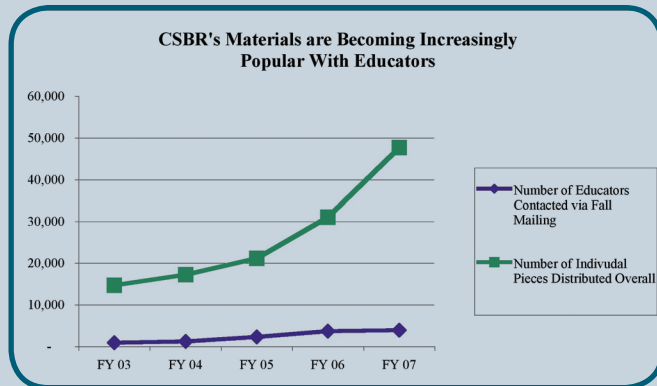

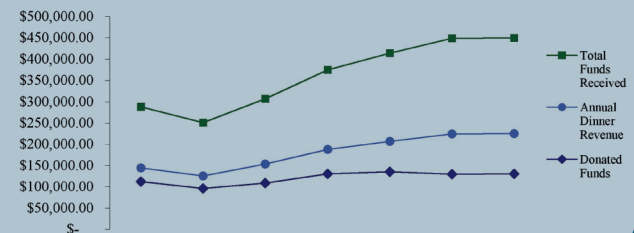
